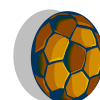
Multi-Use Games Area

General Reminders



If your child needs to take medication of some form, please contact the office staff who will be happy to help. Forms will need to be signed and please check that medication is in date. Pupils should arrive to school in a school uniform, **including sensible shoes** which must be black/brown and **not** trainers. If your child wears earrings, plain studs are permitted. If they can't be removed, tape should be brought in to cover the earrings on PE days. Coats are now also needed. PE kits should be brought in, along with a book bag. Lunchboxes will now be stored on pupil's pegs. If your child's lunchbox doesn't have a handle, it will need to either be placed in the school bag, or if it's too big, be brought in in a separate carrier bag.

Punctuality

Due to our Read Write Inc. groups, assemblies are now from 10:05 from Monday to Thursday. Friday's assembly remains at 9am. As a result, pupils come straight into school and begin work. If your child is late, he/she is missing out on key learning. Please ensure KS1 children are ready to enter the school at 8:45. KS 2 children should be in the top playground, ready to line up, by 8:40 when the whistle is blown.
