Spicy Challenge

You may have heard your child talking about a chilli challenge in maths recently so I thought I'd explain. In order to foster independence and motivated pupils in maths lessons, children are given the option of selecting their challenge from three differentiated activities. These are known as mild, medium and hot activities, hot being the most challenging. On certain days, depending on the concepts taught that day, children then have the opportunity to respond by challenging themselves. This is helping to build on the self-initiated tasks they are introduced to in Reception and promote ambition amongst pupils as they seek to improve and enjoy the challenge of new tasks. This is of course overseen by teaching staff.

Mother Language Day

As a Unicef Rights Respecting School, it is important to us that we value and promote the 54 articles agreed by the majority of countries around the world on the rights of children. Article 30 states that children have the right to practise their own culture, language and religion – or any they choose. To celebrate the diversity that exists within our community, we will be setting a day aside for a Mother Language Day - 21^{st} February. Teachers will be celebrating the different languages and cultures represented within their classes, as well as looking at the Unicef countries their classes are named after.

Holiday Requests

Under section 7 of the education Act 1996, there is no entitlement for you to take your child on holiday during term time. You may be fined for taking your child on holiday during term time without consent of the school. An absence should be considered carefully and avoided if possible. Absence during term time will disrupt a pupils learning and progress. Pupils are expected to attend every session available to them throughout the school year.

An exceptional circumstances form must be completed in writing (see website or contact the office) and addressed to the Headteacher by parents informing of the intended absence and detailing the exceptional circumstances. Exceptional circumstances are defined as "rare, significant, unavoidable and short". The Headteacher will consider the circumstances for absence and confirm in writing whether the absence will be marked authorised or unauthorised on the pupil's attendance record. Each request will be judged on a case by case basis. If an event can be reasonably scheduled outside of term-time then it would not be normal to authorise absence for such an event - holidays are therefore not considered 'exceptional circumstances'.

Safer Internet Week

Following Safer Internet Day on Tuesday 6th February, all classes have been taught about the safe use of the internet. Please take some time over the holidays to review your child's online habits and check that games and contacts are suitable. A particular area to focus on is the 'friends' children make online when playing games. There are a wide range of social media and gaming platforms that encourage children to interact with others.
